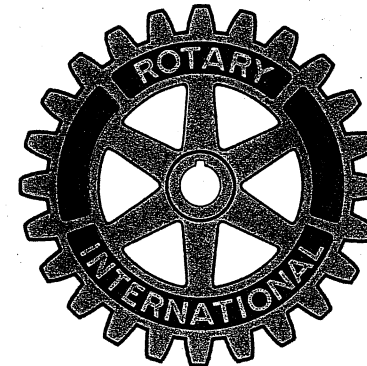

We are pleased to welcome Herman Morris, President of Memphis Light, Gas and Water as our speaker today.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

In the absence of Dana Davis, CHRIS McDERMOTT introduced the program. Jeff Sanford was introduced as our speaker.

Jeff Sanford was appointed to fill a vacancy on the City Council in 1977 and later ran twice and was elected to two terms. In 1973, he was the manager of the Convention Center.

As the manager of the Center City Commission, Jeff is concerned with the development of the downtown area. "The rebirth of the downtown was as the result of a Downtown Partnership," Jeff Said. This partnership with the private sector brought about great changes to the downtown area. Jeff spoke of the many developments in the area. These included BEALE STREET which is now a tourist destination. AUTOZONE PARK was the result of an impossible dream but in reality, it brings much to the downtown area. From the Summer of 1982, the MUD ISLAND development came as the result of some \$67 Million. This area has been neglected but new plans are afoot for it.

Future developments include JEFFERSON RIVER ESTATES - 400 units of living space on the north end of the area. Condos at the YACHT CLUB will also add much to the area. A new second YACHT CLUB MARINA has been built and a third one is planned. A new LANGUAGE IMMERSION school is about ready to open. This school teaches Spanish to pre-schoolers.

Other great contributions come from St. Jude, the Punch District, the Performing Arts Center, Central Station and 300,000 sq. ft. Peabody Place.
