

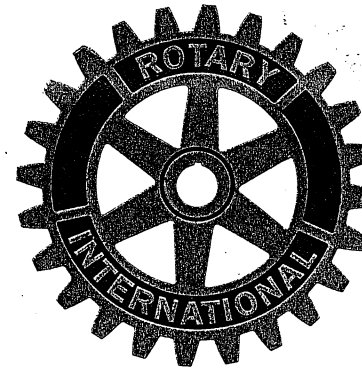

### **GROUND ZERO**

Citizens of the United States have been in great shock after the events of September 11<sup>th</sup>. Two miles away, Rotary Foundation Trustee Chairman Luis

Vincente Giay and his wife Celia watched the nightmare unfold before their eyes from the vantage point of their 35<sup>th</sup> floor hotel window across from the United Nations Headquarters. Giay was on the phone talking to an RI Staff member in Evanston, Illinois when the first hijacked plane smashed into the North Tower of the World Trade Center.

Ironically, Giay was in town to speak about the Rotary Foundation’s humanitarian and peace efforts. They were trapped in New York for days, unable to board a flight, a train or even a bus. Police had barricaded the roads for security purposes. On the fifth day, the Giays waited in long lines to rent a car, then drove non stop for 14 hours to Evanston.

“When we crossed the George Washington Bridge, we felt a sense of relief and said ‘Now we can pray.’ “ This act of war was to most difficult thing they had ever experienced including an earthquake in India and a volcano in Ecuador.
