

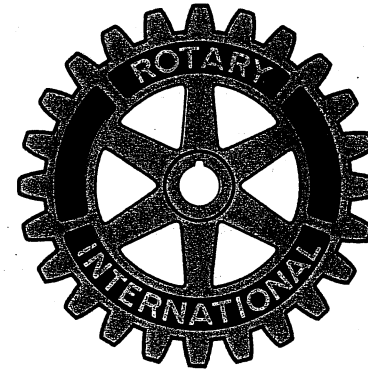

### **A WALK THROUGH HISTORY**

*To get acquainted with the "essential" San Antonio-its hisotric downtown area-walking is the best way to go.*

*There is a pedestrian tradition here that dates back to the city's 18<sup>th</sup> century origins. By decree of the king of Spain, its initial construction included many plazas dedicated to leisurely street life. A major thouroughfare was named La Alameda, Spanish for "the promenade." Here fashionable ladies and gentlemen strolled on Sundays, greeting their neighbors and showing off their finest clothes.*

*Today, Alameda is the bustling Commerce Street, and walkers are apt to be casually dressed tourists, more intent on sightseeing than being seen. But there's still more sauntering than speed-walking here, and downtown's streets and squares are still full of people to see and things to do.*

Interestingly enough, Emerge is a Memphis Incubator Systems Program which due to its size and involvement forms a nucleus around which all of these companies can grow and perform.
