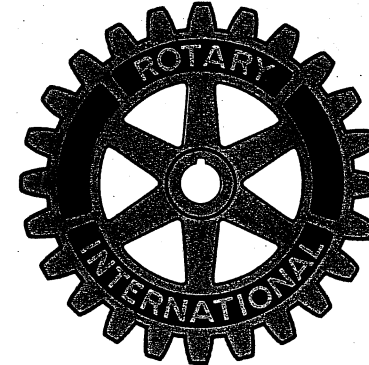

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Program Chair Dana Davis was pleased to introduce Marjorie Gerald as our speaker for the day. Marjorie, who is married to Dr. Barry Gerald, is a member of the Board of Directors of Theatre Memphis, Memphis Botanic Garden and others. She is on the speaker's bureau for The Wonders Series, The Botanic Garden, Memphis Brooks Museum of Art, Dixon Gallery and Gardens and historic Elmwood Cemetery. Marjorie gave us an interesting slant on Elmwood in that she presented a history of Memphis and related it to the cemetery in that she pointed out the tombs and monuments for early Memphis leaders. She began with the first signs of settlement with the bluffs and followed it through its involvement with the Mississippi River. She pointed out the various generals who were involved in the Civil War and showed their places of burial. Charles Adams was the grandfather of Helen Keller.

In the 1870's, 50000 people died from yellow fever. 25000 of these are buried at Elmwood. Elmwood encompasses 80 acres. This was a good presentation.
