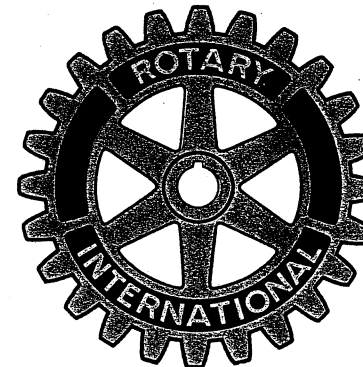

CLUB MEMBERSHIP

Perhaps the single most effective way that Rotarians can strengthen Rotary's ability to do good in the world is by increasing club membership. In addition to infusing your Rotary club with fresh ideas, energy and enthusiasm, new members can help your club to broaden its service base, expanding the number or scope of the projects it undertakes. During 2000-2001, R. E. President Frank Devlyn is stressing the importance of membership growth and strongly encouraging all clubs and districts to increase their numbers. To foster the accomplishment of this worthy goal, he is promoting special incentive programs. Please be a part of this effort.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Program Director Dana Davis really pulled a coup with her speaker for the day. Dana had the new Director of Police, Walter Crews as our speaker for the day.

Since joining the department as a patrolman in 1969, Crews has advanced through the ranks, becoming a deputy director in 1995 and being named interim director in December. He is credited with establishing the department's Crisis Intervention Team, cited nationally as a model for police dealing with mentally disturbed people. He said that his promotion would give him leeway to make changes he has wanted to make.

"We now have an effective leadership," he said, "our diversity is our strength." With a budget of \$148 million, items like bank robberies, traffic, youth, juvenile squad take much of the funds. The organized crime unit will now be the division of Vice and Narcotics. The mission statement is based on Integrity, Honesty and Character. He promised that the police department will now be in the neighborhoods systematically. This was an excellent presentation.
