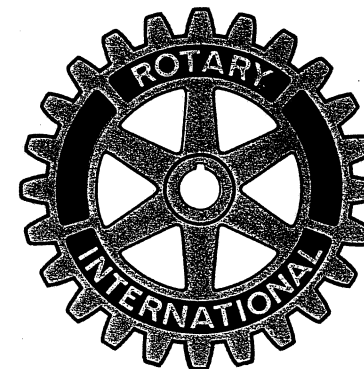

Following his years at Ole Miss, he went back to school, this time to learn, and to make some contribution to life about him. He took five years of Greek and became a teacher at the now Crighton. He grew up in a football family with three uncles eventually coaching. After WW II, Johnny Vaught came home to Ole Miss and brought a militaristic attitude. He exercised total control over his players. (nor do you need teeth, he was reminded.)

His years during the late forties and fifties were quite hilarious and he was delightful in his approach to humor.
