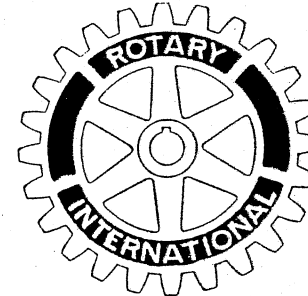

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Jim Drake brought his friend and neighbor Larry Scroggs to speak to us about what was accomplished in the 100th General Assembly. Larry is the State Representative for the 94th Legislative District. Some of the highlights of the assembly were:

The legislature passed a fully balanced \$15.6 billion budget with no new taxes.

Full funding of the Basic Education Program for K-12 was maintained with an increase of \$83 million in increased spending for public schools.

Tennessee's education budget is at an all time high of \$2.85 Billion.

The Safe School Act will purchase metal detectors and hire security personnel.

A new offense of Impaired Driving will apply with a .08 or .09 blood alcohol.

Fourth time DUI now constitutes a felony and drivers registering .20 or more will face a mandatory seven days in jail for the first offense.

A new job skills program funded from overages in Unemployment Insurance Fund was created.
