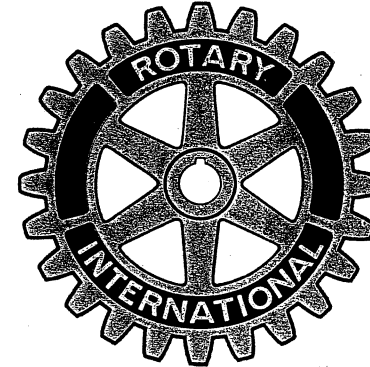

### **LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM**

PROGRAM DIRECTOR DANA DAVIS introduced Tennessee Representative Larry Scroggs as our speaker for the day.

Larry, a resident of Germantown, has an office in Collierville and represents the 94<sup>th</sup> Legislative District in the Tennessee Legislature.

The 101<sup>st</sup> meeting of the Tennessee General Assembly passed a balanced budget of \$18.3 Billion using natural growth in current taxes instead of imposing new taxes. Of this dollar amount, \$5 Billion goes to TennCare. The full funding of the Basic Education Program for grades K-12 was maintained with \$90 million in increased spending for public schools. Comprehensive reforms were implemented for day care centers, providing for better enforcement rules, accountability, audits and safety measures. State employees, teachers and higher education faculty received a 3 ½ % raise for the new budget year. TennCare anti-fraud legislation was approved to curtail abuse by those who apply for and receive benefits through misrepresentation. Legislation establishing a graduated driver's license program for teens was enacted to give young drivers more experience prior to obtaining unrestricted licenses.

Has your evening meal been interrupted by a telemarketing call? A "Do not call Registry" was approved this year moving up the ban on telemarketers from contacting consumers who place their names on a "no call" list. It takes 60 days for this to be implemented following your request to be included on the list.

In the area of Wildlife Preservation, the State Legislature has approved a bill which helps the TWRA to fund future wildlife and conservation efforts without increased costs to sportsmen.
