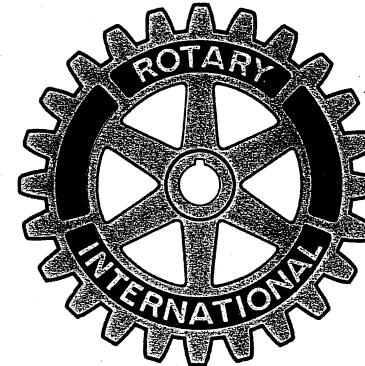

### LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

We were given a history of the Med last week by its president, Bruce Steinhauer. From its beginning in 1829 as the Hospital of the South, its purpose was to treat people who worked on the river. It was moved to the Forest Park area in 1838 and was integrated in 1845. After the Civil War it became the Memphis City Hospital and was highlighted as a treatment for Cholera and Yellow Fever in the 1880's. In 1938, John Gaston was built and it became a center for kidney dialysis. The Medical School became affiliated in 1929. The problems of the uninsured still exist today as 30% of the citizens have no insurance. The Med is supported by the City of Memphis and Shelby County.
