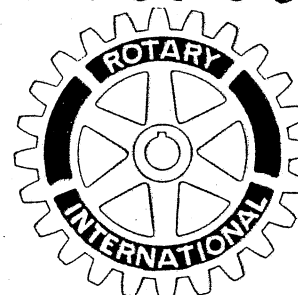

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Rotarian Burt Waller, a native of Bolivar, Tennessee, is the President and CEO of the Med. Prior to the program, half of the audience was given an Opinion Survey to determine what they knew about the Regional Medical Center in Memphis. The other half was given a survey to be completed after the program. Burt's responsibilities include: the direction and operation of a complex 450 bed teaching hospital with services including Level I Trauma, Regional Burn Center and Regional Perinatal Center; directing strategic repositioning focused on creating an integrated delivery system capable of assuming risk for comprehensive health care services spanning the components of acute, subacute, diagnostic, specialty physician and primary care. He has developed a community-based primary care network through development of Memphis Family Care Centers and recruitment of physicians.

The innovative labor-management contract which incorporates commitment to the patient care mission, streamlines salary and benefit programs, involves employee committees in decision making and ended a prolonged period of internal strife.

Shelby County contributes 15% of the 160 million dollar budget which is 24.6 million while the Med has provided 52 million in indigent care. 6 Million of this indigent care went to Mississippi residents and 7 million to Arkansas residents with no payment from either state. More than 1000 patients reach the hospital each year via helicopter. The Med is especially proud of the Newborn Center founded by Dr. Sheldon Korones. Their Trauma unit is without comparison and the vast work done with Sickle Cell Anemia is unsurpassed even in the nation.

We certainly appreciate the fine work that Burt Waller is doing with the Med and certainly appreciate his taking the time to share this good news with us.
